#### Plush Donuts Sewing Pattern

#### Supplies needed:

Basic supplies: Sewing machine Thread Sewing needle Pins Scissors Patterns Mark-B-Gone Pen (optional)

Plush Donuts: Fleece cotton fabric: Brown (chocolate) or beige (vanilla) for the donut Felt or fleece fabric in various colors and patterns as desired for the frosting Polyester stuffing Embroidery floss and needle to match the fabric color of the donut

For donut E: White and brown felt fabric for eyes Black embroidery floss for mouth

Options for donut "sprinkles":

Plastic jewels Embroidery floss in various colors Fabric paint pen Patterned fleece fabric Mini pompoms Buttons Colored glitter glue Google eyes and embroidery floss for mouth to make a face


Hot glue gun or sticky glue to glue on the sprinkles

Pattern pieces create donuts in five sizes

#### A 3 inches

- B 5 1/2 inches
- C 8 inches
- D 11 inches
- E 13 inches

To stitch the donuts, you will machine stitch around the outer rim of the donut and whipstitch by hand around the inner rim with embroidery floss and needle. See illustration below for how to whipstitch.



Print the coloring pages so kids can decorate their donut shop and advertise their delicious donuts!

Pattern pages includes pattern pieces to make donuts in 5 different sizes. Donut pattern pages are labeled A through E for the different donut and frosting sizes. Donut E, the largest one, includes templates for eyes and the frosting pattern includes an illustrated mouth that can also be sewn on to make a face.

To sew the mouth, you will backstitch using embroidery floss and needle. See illustration below for how to backstitch.

Backstitch

Some pattern pieces print on multiple pages and need to be taped together. For each of the donut sizes, match up the letters on the patterns and use them as a guide to taping the pattern pieces together. Taped along the dashed lines. Directions:

Select the pattern for the donut size you would like to create.

Pin the donut pattern on double layered fleece fabric and cut along the outside as well as the donut hole. Use brown for chocolate and beige for vanilla. With fabric right sides together, stitch the outer rim of the donut. Do not stitch around the hole in the middle.



Reverse right side out. Insert polyester stuffing around the entire donut and whipstitch the pieces together around the inside of the hole. Insert more stuffing as needed as you stitch.



Pin the frosting pattern to felt or fleece fabric and cut around the rim as well as the hole in the middle.



If opting to stitch the sprinkles, stitch them now. Using various color of embroidery floss and needle, stitch long sprinkles all over the frosting as desired.



Glue the frosting to the top of the donut.

If using pompoms, buttons or plastic jewels as sprinkles, glue them on now all over the frosting as desired. Hot glue gun in recommended.



You can also just use fleece fabric with a decorative pattern.



You can also use glitter glue to drizzle frosting all over the top.






Glue on plastic google eyes and backstitch a smile with embroidery floss and needle to give your donut a face!




For donut E, cut two eyes from white felt fabric and 2 pupils from black felt fabric. Glue black pupils to the white eyes. Glue the white eyes to the top of the donut. Using black embroidery floss, backstitch a mouth at the bottom of the donut using short stitches to make his face. He can be the donut shop mascot.





