
How to Make Juggling Balls the Easy Way

For each ball you will need...



(size- 25 cm)

(small round bird seed)

Important: The above ingredients are needed to make one juggling ball. As most people will make three balls each you will need three times the amount of balloons and seed per person.

For the construction of the balls you will need... (1 set per 4 or 5 participants)



A pin



Sticky tape



Sharp scissors





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Large plastic bottle (to make a funnel)

Thin cardboard (the inside of a toilet roll works well)

Small plastic bottle

Before the workshop make a 'wide neck' funnel.



1. Cut the top off the large plastic bottle.



3. Cut a 3.5 cm x 12 cm rectangle of cardboard,







2. Keep the top bit. (recycle the bottom bit)

4....wrap it around the neck

5. ... and tape it in place.

Making the balls





8. Now make two more balls and you are ready to learn how to juggle.

<u>Teacher Tips</u>

Save time measuring

To make sure all the balls end up the same size pour $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of seed into the small bottle and mark the seed line with a permanent marker. This way you can save time measuring the seed and just pour in the birdseed until it comes up to the line.

Save time in large workshops – pre making the balloons

To save time in a large workshop with children you can pre fill and knot 2 balloons for each participant. You can also cut the necks off the covering balloons. Each participant can make one ball from beginning to end and then finish off the other 2 balls.

Keep it tidy

Store your birdseed in a large plastic bottle with a lid. It is easier and less messy to pour seed from a bottle than from the plastic bag that the seed comes in.
